# New Name, Same Focus: The Great Commission

# GlobalGrace

"Go Ye... is that Chinese?" responded some college students when I told them the name of our organization. The Old English "Ye" sounded Chinese to these students. However, if I said "Ngohdeih yiu heui saai gaai chyun fukyam," you might have no idea what I was saying, but a Cantonese believer would light up, knowing that those words mean "Go into all the world and preach the Good News of Jesus."

And if I quoted a passage from Chaucer memorized in high school,

Whan that Aprill with his shoures soote,

The droghte of March hath perced to the roote,

And bathed every veyne in swich licour...

you might wonder what in the world I was babbling about.

Today "go ye" sounds as archaic and incomprehensible as Chaucer's Canterbury Tales. "Go Ye into all the world" touches the hearts of people who grew up with King James Bibles. And many Psalms or hymns in King James English are beautiful. But to younger people they may sound more like a foreign language.

Our board, staff, and missionaries have had many discussions about changing our name to communicate our vision to the current generation while still affirming Go Ye's rich history. In September, after much deliberation and prayer, we agreed on **GlobalGrace Fellowship**. This new name carries much of what Go Ye Fellowship suggests – a fellowship of people committed to carrying the gospel of grace to all peoples.

"Global" highlights our commitment to work toward going to all peoples globally.

"Grace" is the heart of our message – God's incredible, costly, contrary-to-what-we-deserve favor.

"Fellowship" represents a band of people committed together to Christ's global mission.

We are building on the long legacy of Go Ye Fellowship. Since 1932, the name Go Ye Fellowship has gone into more than 40 countries. Many have been eternally impacted under this banner. Great missionaries have carried that name and advanced Christ's Kingdom.

And their children and teens will again get to take part in a fun, age appropriate program designed just for them!

Please pray for your missionaries, that God would open up that time for them to attend and for the means to be able to travel to the States next summer.



# Opportunity in the Philippines:

## Philippine Outreach Gets "Technical"

or three years we prayed and sought God's direction for *Great Commission Missionary Training Center*, and the Lord showed us His new vision for the Center. It is to open our doors and expand ministry to the Out-of-School-Youth and Persons-with-Disability community in our area by starting a trade and technical school program in partnership with the Philippine government trade program, TESDA. This program provides accreditation to trade skills such as culinary arts, baking, hotel and restaurant services, arc welding, metal and wood machining, massage therapy, and plumbing, among others.

More exciting is that this program is a great evangelistic opportunity for us and the local churches in our area. Every time we teach a trade skill, we devote 3 hours for skill training, 30 minutes for financial literacy, and 30 minutes for spiritual development. The spiritual development portion of the training is actually part of the Philippine government's Moral Recovery Program. We are all excited to work on this program. In fact, some of our staff have also

taken a trade skill course themselves so that they could be our instructors in the future.



### **Livelihood and Skills Training program:**

We have held two six-week *Massage Therapy* sessions. A total of 21 people graduated from this course, and of these 14 came to know Jesus through the program. These new believers are being followed up by volunteer staff through Bible study.

In our partnership with the nearby drug rehab facility, 25 residents completed the *Plumbing and Scaffolding* course. An additional 20 drug rehab patients are taking the second Plumbing and Scaffolding course. We have also conducted the financial literacy and spiritual foundations course with them.



# Looking for a mission opportunity in the Philippines next year?

We could accommodate your small group who can do carpentry, welding, painting or plumbing. Your group could do renovations in our school or teach basic welding, painting or plumbing.

#### **Please Pray:**

- 1. Pray for God's favor on all of our students.
- 2. Pray for partners willing to invest in this program, particularly to build/set up our laboratories. We hope to build a welding and machine shop laboratory and a kitchen facility for culinary arts and repaint the whole building by next year.
- 3. Pray as we seek accreditation with the TESDA office as an authorized center for livelihood training.
- 4. Thirty Filipino pastors in Mindanao (a predominantly Muslim region) are requesting pastoral training seminars on preaching, financial literacy, and marital health. We hope to begin preparations in the next few months and run this program in February 2017.
- 5. After years of difficulty, Jason's voice has partially recovered. He is now able to take speaking invitations; however, by the end of the session, his voice is strained and his throat hurts. So he can only take limited speaking invitations or once-a-week teaching assignments.

We are grateful for you as you faithfully uphold us in prayer.

# **Teamwork for His Glory**

od often brings about His Kingdom goals through missionaries working as a team. Go Ye has several missionaries in such team settings. By far our largest team effort is the *Isaiah 55 Ministry* in Reynosa, Mexico.

The core of the ministry is two schools for deaf children, one traditional and one vocational – but there is so much more! During the summer months, Isaiah 55 hosts several large short-term teams from various US churches, often doing construction projects and Bible camps for kids. They also have sports ministries as well as various practical outreaches to the surrounding community. Go Ye just added to our fellowship two more men who are joining Isaiah 55, and we want to introduce them.



Mario Xoca and his wife Keila have been living in Reynosa, Mexico for 17 years. They have two teenage children. As a young 18 year old finishing high school, Mario was "looking for something" that would give meaning to his life. He prayed every day and started to read his Bible, but could not understand it. When he met Keila and she shared the Gospel with him, Mario finally knew what that "something" was. He accepted Jesus as Lord, and was baptized. Mario has served in several churches in the Reynosa area. As a bivocational pastor, he has a passion for sharing the Gospel and leads Bible studies three or four evenings a week. Eventually, Mario and Keila started a church in their home which soon reached 50-60 adults and 25 children.

Two years ago, Mario started leading VBS with Isaiah 55, and the relationship grew. Now he has been asked to serve as the full-time pastor of the Isaiah 55 ministry, leading the staff and teachers in devotions, Bible study, and worship. Using his many years of experience as an engineer, he will also play a key role in further developing the vocational and production ministries in Aquiles Serdán, the impoverished neighborhood where Isaiah 55 is working. In the evenings, Mario will continue ministry with his local church fellowship.

Please pray for Mario and Keila in their new roles with the ministry. Mario is a very hard worker and we do not want him to over-extend himself. Pray that the love of Jesus will naturally overflow on those God brings his way. Also, pray for Mario and Keila as they trust God for the much-needed financial support for their family as they serve.

Carlos Gutierrez grew up near the U.S. and Mexican border. He was raised in a Christian environment and his grandfather was a pastor, but Carlos did not know Jesus in a personal way until age 28. He had been seeking a purpose for his life, and five years ago God led him to find this purpose – to proclaim God's Kingdom, especially in the realm of education. An invitation by his cousin Mario Xoca led Carlos to take a look at the Isaiah 55 ministry in Reynosa. He saw this as an opportunity to work with deaf youth to bring them to relationship with Christ. What Carlos did not initially see was an opportunity to bring him into a relationship with a young lady as well....

At Isaiah 55, Carlos met Go Ye missionary Erin Knobloch, and in God's providence the two married this past July. Several people had encouraged Carlos to pursue the relationship, including Mario's mother-in-law (thank the Lord for mothers).

Carlos has begun his role of creating/consolidating a Gospel-centered curriculum and also providing Biblical training in Spanish for the deaf and hearing teachers so that they, in turn, can



teach the deaf students. Erin has been working in Mexico for thirteen years. She continues to be heavily involved in the administration and vision of the ministry and has begun to shift into a more advisory role, allowing the newer missionaries plenty of hands-on opportunities.

Pray for Carlos and Erin as they adjust to married life and also as they fit in as a couple now with the Isaiah 55 missionary family. Finally, pray for Carlos to make new friends as he continues to adapt to life and ministry in Reynosa.


